Darrell is incarcerated on death row in San Quentin, California. As an indigent inmate, he needs financial support. Any amount is welcomed and appreciated!

He needs your financial support for his daily life because he has *no income* for his basic needs like: food, clothing, toiletries, paper, pens, envelopes, stamps & books.

There are 5 ways to contribute:

1. Instant money on his books: For your ease, we invite you to go to www.ipay.com and search for Darrell Lomax K-27402 (at San Quentin State prison, California). On that homepage you send money directly to his inmate account via your credit card. You can even set it up for automatic contributions!

2. Money Orders could take as long as a month to process into his books, but when it gets there it's so *very much appreciated!*

The Money Order must have his CDC#: K-27402 clearly written on it.

3. Packages

Keep in mind:

~ The *frequency* of packages received by the inmate is *limited*.

~ The package *weight* is *limited*.

~ The package *contents* are *limited*

Because of the restrictions, rules and regulations the arrival of a "Surprise" package could prevent the inmate from receiving important items needed for basic well-being.

Thus, it is **very important to communicate** your kind intentions **to the inmate** before you purchase a package for them.

The inmate is more likely to know the *current* rules the facility has regarding:

1. *what* the inmate can receive
2. *how often* the inmate can receive
3. *where* the package can come from

A list of approved vendors is provided here since packages coming to a San Quentin inmate will be turned away unless items are approved and sent through proper means.

4. early 2009 - MAILROOM Allowances and Limitations:

For the most updated info call: 1-415-454-1460 (ask for mailroom) press "O" & ask your questions.

You may personally send through the mail *only* below listed items A – K.

- A. 2 ink pens: clear barrel - Blue or Black ink only (no gel ink – no rubber support grids
 - a. In pack or out of pack / ok
- B. 40 stamps = 1 "book" of Forever stamps
- C. (Every time the Post Office changes cost of postage, inmates get caught with oddball stamps. Sending them "Forever" stamps makes their life easier.)
- D. Plain Envelopes: 40 or Pre-Postal-Stamped Envelopes: 40
- E. Sheets of paper: 200 limit – NO cardboard backing - NO tablets – NO binding – NO spirals
- F. Sheets of drawing paper 150 blank.
- G. Sheets of paper size limit: 8 ½ x 11
- H. Photographs 100 limit – up to 8 ½ by 11 – NOT Polaroid – NOT hand-painted - NOT hand-colored pictures
- I. Sketches must be in pen ink or pencil. - NOT felt-tip markers. NO decorations with: glitter - gels - stickers
- J. MO's = Money Orders in inmate's name with CDC#
- K. *Books: 2 paperbacks – from publisher or any bookstore - Used & New - NO size limit

*Books & Packages are never allowed directly from the person contributing to the inmate. Books & Packages must come from a 3rd party vendor.

VENDORS: Only *certain* Venders are approved by San Quentin.

5. Quarterlies: Each inmate is allowed from 0 (zero) to 4 Packages each year. This allowance can change from time to time. **Contacting the inmate** will let you know whether he is *currently* eligible and what items will serve him best at the time you are ready to support him. Inmates privileged to get 4 packages a year, get 1 package each quarter of the year. We call these packages "Quarterlies".

6. SPO: There is another variable that changes from time to time. An "SPO" is a Special Purchase Order which *might* be allowed upon special approval without regard to the "Quarterlies." **Contacting the inmate** will let you know whether he is *currently* eligible for an "SPO" and what items will serve him best at the time you are ready to support him.
